



UCLA * INSTITUTE OF THE ENVIRONMENT * REEF CHECK

In 2003, I teamed up with UCLA's Institute of the Environment to study coral reef health in the Pacific. I received training for laying transects, recognizing indicator species, recording data, and reporting findings back to Dr. Gregor Hodson at UCLA. Over the past fifteen years, I have personally led student research groups to the Fijian islands as well as serving as the program director for teams gathering data on three different islands. IGS sets up homestays for students in Fijian villages as they conduct their research. Results are submitted to local officials, regional politicians, and the Institute of the Environment to map changes in reef health on three Fijian islands. Our transects = 100m length / 5m wide. Monitoring includes: 1) fish count for nine indicator species; 2) ten benthic cover indicators (soft coral to silt); 3) crown of thorns numbers; 4) invertebrate counts; 5) review and conclusions on reef health over time.
